10) Amount of STD’s (Here is full documentation for my statistics, and they need a more detailed explanation, because these facts are really being hidden from the public)

The STD rates are symbolic of what's really going on in education (and elsewhere). The STD rates are so out of control in America, particularly in the Black community, that the PC backlash has tended to try and hide them.

Fortunately, the CDC stands behind their reports, but you have to do specific searches to get all the info. This is one of the most under-reported and dangerous issues in our country.

Based solely on the CDC report: Overall, the number of STD cases in America is 110 million (one-third of our entire population. Take away the very young and very old, and you can see how the 40% rate for 15-24 year-olds is arrived at. (And 50% of annual new STD infections are in the high-school age range).

You'll see that the Herpes rate in Blacks ages 15-49 is 39+%, with the rate for Black women at 48% (Google-search "48% herpes rate Black women CDC" and you'll get countless references.) Add to that the STD rates for half-a-dozen other diseases, and the rate among all our kids is well beyond the percent I quoted.

Here's another CDC link showing the HIV infection rate among Blacks to be 8 times greater than Whites, with about 20% of infected people of ALL races unaware that they have it.

Again, you have to do very specific searches to get this info. There's been much effort to cover up this STD information, similar to what the schools have done for years with hiding/misleadingly reporting academic learning scores, violent incidents, drug use, and graduation rates (e.g.: simple searches will claim dropout rates ranging between 2% and 40+%). The federal government sites are typically the most deceptive.
